Students who wish to take Reading must choose either "Reading 712" or "Reading Japanese Modern Literature."

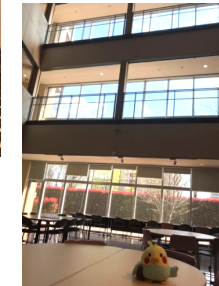
